To mitigate the amount of time spent in the classroom, all CPR/FA classes held in the Great Falls office and Lewistown will be conducted in the American Heart Associations blended course model.

Students will need to complete the Pediatric First Aid CPR online portion before attending in-person skills sessions, completing the additional Adult CPR/AED modules. Please be advised that this takes between 4-6 hours.

A printed copy of the Certificate of Completion will need to be brought to the skills class. This certificate is not your official card, students need to pass the skills portion for licensing purposes.

Students will be required to register for a skills class through Family Connections. Online course is \$20.00 and due at the time of enrollment through the website. In-person skills classes are \$25.00 payable to Family Connections and due the day before class to reserve the spot. Please call the Great Office to schedule skills classes and make payment.
